MOVIN' ON LAUNCHES MUSICIAN SPOTLIGHT SERIES

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa., Feb. 7 – Movin' On, Penn State University's annual music festival will be launching its Musician Spotlight series tomorrow at the HUB-Robeson Center. The Movin' On Musician Spotlight is in collaboration with the Student Programming Association (SPA) and aims to promote student and local acts. The event will take place from 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. at the monumental staircase in the HUB-Robeson Center.

The lineup for the event includes Shalom Dubas, Intermission Improv and TV Dinners. First to perform at 11:00 a.m. is **Shalom Dubas**, a singer-songwriter and senior at Penn State. Shalom has never been one to put herself in one genre: "I also rap and play guitar, so I try to merge all of that into one unique sound.
